

Amy Northwest Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

All parent meetings, trainings, and workshops are advertised in a variety of ways to reach as many parents as possible. A parental meeting to include parental input for the parent involvement plan was held on April 7,2025. This meeting was advertised by parent link phone / email messages, flyer, website, and email. During the meeting parents were given the opportunity to review the plans, discuss policy and edit as needed.

Section B: ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Amy Northwest will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact.

The principal will present the Title 1 requirements to parents and guardians during a Parent Information meeting at our Annual Back to School Night in Fall 2025 at AMY NW Middle School. During this session the principal will present to parents about both academic content and achievement standards, state level testing and how to work with educators to monitor their child's progress and help them to further their achievement. Throughout the school year parents will be encouraged to participate in report card conferences, login to schoolnet and parent portal, and sign up for remind me app to keep up on students progress. All of this is advertised through school messenger phone calls, letters home, school building announcements, and during conferences.

The annual family enagement policy and compact will be sent home via postal mail. We hold monthly meetings for parents, we inform them of upcoming meetings by sending out flyers a week in advance and giving out a monthly calendar at the end of each month for the next month. We send out robo-call reminders and have a posting of each month's activities at our front desk. Phone calls home will be made for extremely important meetings as well.

We host our meetings mostly in the morning. Due to our school not being a neighborhood school, we found through surveys that meetings are better attended and received when hosted before work hours. Report card conferences also include evening sessions and back to school night provides an additional timeframe to meet varying needs and schedules of parents. Zoom meetings will be held as an alternative for families that are not able to attned in person.

All new and current students' EH 40s will be reviewed in September to see if information needs to be sent home in a parent friendly language format. Translations are always available upon request through the district Multilingual Office.

Parent information and brochures are available to parents in an area outside the school office, just as they enter the building at the front desk. Our counselor also coordinates and provides information as needed and requested by families for outside agencies that support various family needs including but not limited to, food stability, counseling, housing and clothing needs. Parents and students are encouraged to attend College and Career events to meet with representatives from local colleges and partners. Parents and students are also encouraged to attend high school events so that they are prepared with an understanding of the high school process and the options that are available for school choice.

Amy Northwest will build the parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:

Throughout the school year parents will be encouraged to participate in report card conferences, login to schoolnet and parent portal, and sign up for remind me app to keep up on students progress.

All parent engagement activities and school events are advertised through school messenger phone calls, letters home, and during conferences.

The principal at Back to School night discusses with parents how to login in to school net and Parent Portal to track student grades and progress. Literature is also provided to explain how to login to the parent portal and school net. Teachers will review with parents during individual parent conferences as well as report card conferences how to keep track their student's achievement.

AMY Northwest teachers will send home login and password information for online intervention programs for students who need to address weak skill areas. Parents will be provided training on the programs during the fall and as requested during the school year. Parent workshops and academic events are also planned thorughout the year as determined by the family input surveys that are sent out in the fall each year.

Amy Northwest will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:

The Professional development day, in August 2025, will include a presentation to all instructional and non-instructional staff by the Principal on how to provide great customer service, reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners and building strong ties with parents. This effort will be revisited on early dismissal day and full days of professional development during the school year.

Parent survey results will be reviewed with staff before the first report card conference and will inform training topics for teachers/staff.

Teachers will reach out minimally every 6 weeks with student's progress notifications. Regular communications will take the forms of monthly calendars, monthly newsletter, Parent Link, Parent Meetings and all School District of Philadelphia correspondences. Teachers will also receive professional development on working with teenagers aligned to how the teenage brain works and how they can leverage that knowledge with work with and help families to work with their students.

Amy Northwest will provide other reasonable support for parent and family engagement activities under Section 1116 as parents may request by:

Provide professional development by parents/caregivers for new and existing principals and other administrators on how to develop promising partnerships with parents/caregivers.

Train new and existing staff with parental engagement duties

Coordinate with the FACE office to maintain a strong SAC team and meet monthly if possible throughout the school year Provide coordination of professional development efforts throughout the school year

Provide workshops to parents on supporting student achievement and parent engagement including arts and curriculum nights, growth mindset, STEAM night.
